This became an intergenerational event when Mrs. Smith's 3rd grade class at Olde Creek Elementary School and The Junior League Volunteers of Vienna made beautiful handmade cards for each of the Cheer Bags.



"The students were so excited to participate in this project," said Mrs. Smith from Olde Creek Elementary. "So much thought, effort, and care went into each card. A second generation of leaders has carried it forward over the past 10 years or so, none more important than Bill Farrell, a member of the board since 2008 and the chair from 2015 through 2020.
