I find myself reflecting on the many lessons learned as we emerge from the pandemic tunnel. Our greatest take-away from being isolated over the past 15 months is that we NEED people. This need is especially crucial for seniors. The SC has truly been focused on doing our part to help **Create a World Without Loneliness** for both our clients and our volunteers. We have continued to provide free rides for our clients to both medical appointments and procedures and companion drives for food and prescription pickups. And, thanks to our Friendly Callers, we've not only

provided socialization for both our senior clients and volunteer callers throughout the pandemic's uncertainties, but also have discovered food insecurities and medical needs among the seniors we support.

Secondly, I have learned to" pivot" and do just about everything virtually. Most of us are now experts on Zoom! We are very fortunate to have the ability to meet virtually, but it really is not the same as meeting in person and shaking hands or sharing a hug with a friend or enjoying a cup of coffee with a colleague.

I am proud to say that the SC office did not close during the pandemic. We have had at least one staff member in the office, and since last June, office volunteers physically have been working in the office. We've followed all of the CDC guidelines, both in the office and for our free transportation services. Having this presence in the office has helped to promote confidence in both our clients and our volunteers that the Shepherd's Center will be there for them when they need us.

Navigating this brave new hybrid world will require creative thinking, compassion, and dedication. SCNOVA is pleased to have **Carolyn Pennington**, a longtime supporter of the SC, at the helm as our new ED starting in early July. As we have grown and changed over the past many years, so, too, have our goals and operational needs. The Caregivers Support Group (CSG) sends an e-newsletter twice a month asking the reader "What gives you joy?" The group's goal is to give and to receive support for caregivers, to learn strategies for dealing with the unique challenges of being a caregiver, and to be of service to others by sharing experiences.

"When we have a long, difficult task, we look to the light at the end of the tunnel as reassurance," states Jack Tarr, SCNOVA volunteer and CSG lead co-facilitator for 15 years, "There is no light for a long-term caregiver." Lynn Rafferty, a SCNOVA volunteer and facilitator of 5 years, found CSG through her caregiver experience, having taken care of her mother for 9 years. Lynn says, "I came to the group to learn how others handle the challenges of caregiving, and for mutual support." When her mother passed away last year, Lynn continued to find support both for her grief and for working "with the legalities that occur with death." As facilitators, Jack and Lynn's goal to help the group continue to be there for others, made them come to a decision in Aug 2020 to start the sessions via Zoom. with participants joining from as far as PA and WVA. "Although we miss the hugs and going out to lunch afterward, the Zoom meetings are a good alternative," says Lynn. The dedication and love caregivers show, day after day, often for years, "is awe-inspiring" for Lynn. "Humility and examples of extreme courage and determination," is what the group has taught Jack. "Finding at least one thing today and every day: a bird, a baby's laugh, a puppy's kiss, a flower, a song, a memory," - to bring you joy.
