"All 250 guests seemed to embody the Gala's theme of 'Celebrating All Who Serve' throughout the evening's activities," said Co-chair Tom Portman.

The Wine Pull, organized by our Board of Directors and directly benefiting veterans, elicited many smiles as some guests "pulled" wine valued at over \$100.

Silent Auction Chair, Leigh Banducci, labeled the Auction "A tremendous success thanks to our 400 bidders and donors of 109 items, who helped us to raise over \$14,400 for SCOV." BidPal technology facilitated on-line item bidding for the first time to help users shop packages, place bids, and monitor their bidding activity on their cell phones or from home. United Bank Vienna and Chainbridge Technologies volunteers were on hand to register our guests and answer bidder's questions.

After dinner SCOV kudos were given by Congressman Gerald E. Connolly, House of Delegates' member, Mark L. Keam, and Title Sponsor, Len Adler, of the Adler Foundation. 

Over the past year, we've heard stories on how we were instrumental in improving the lives of spouses, parents and adult children by encouraging them to make new friends and participate in the opportunities we offer for social engagement, intellectual stimulation, physical activity and independence. That makes us so happy! This year we also answered the need for a Shepherd's Center presence in Reston and Herndon, allowing us to impact even more people with our vision and mission.



I have some great stories to share with you! The first is Kathy, an adult child who works full time and lives an hour away from her 91-year-old dad. She shared with me, "It's nice to know I'm the back-up plan; that's a great peace of mind for me. I know Dad enjoys being involved and making new friendships." Her dad is active and volunteers for us. Another daughter, Cheryl said, "The minute Mom went to her first Adventures in Learning (AIL) class she was sold on it. The value of the program, having a place to go, expands her knowledge and appreciation of the world." Cheryl also shared that because of SCOV, she doesn't have to retire knowing SCOV and our volunteers are there for her mom. Her mom is a volunteer, too.



Our core service is FREE transportation to and from medical appointments or weekly errands such as the grocery store, the pharmacy or the bank. This service is run by our 250+ vetted volunteers who are willing to give of their time to help seniors by escorting them to their appointments; our drivers wait for them and then drive them safely home. Research indicates that the average round trip ride we provide for free would cost \$52.00 in a taxi!*


