Even Better Together: Introducing the Shepherd's Center of Northern VirginiaA letter from the Interim Executive Director

The past year has taught us much about the importance of remaining a vibrant resource for the seniors and caregivers who rely on our services in the communities we serve. Certainly, the pandemic has challenged us to find new ways of tackling most anything you can think of. For our Shepherd's Center, that included taking a look at the way we meet

our mission so we ensure that we continue delivering impactful services as efficiently as possible. Anything that we can do to serve as many of the area's seniors and make aging in place a bit easier makes good sense.

With this in mind, the Shepherd's Center serving Oakton, Vienna, Reston and Herndon and the Shepherd's Center of Great Falls are joining forces to continue assisting area seniors, supporting aging in place and creating a world without loneliness. The newly formed **Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia (SCNOVA)** will continue its partnerships and outreach with the region's faith-based organizations, associations, and local governments to provide free transportation services, companionship, learning opportunities, and caregiver support across our expanded service area.

Several months ago, the two centers began exploring how together we might be able to give our clients and caregivers access to a richer network of services and volunteers as a broader and more efficient organization. Our newly named Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia will give Great Falls seniors access to an enhanced set of services as well as social and educational programs and expands the corps of volunteers available to serve seniors across all of the communities that turn to us for assistance.

As an affiliate of the Shepherd's Centers of America, our mission, in part, is to support our sister organizations in the area. We're excited to welcome Great Falls' vibrant programs and dedicated volunteers to our Oakton, Vienna, Reston and Herndon Shepherd's Center. Transition is ongoing and expected to be completed by Feb. 28. During this time, we will continue to serve our seniors as we complete the work of merging our clients, volunteers and organizations. Free ride services for seniors in Great Falls will continue uninterrupted after the merger. In addition, Great Falls volunteers and clients will be transferred into SCNOVA, allowing for a seamless transition.

We are excited to begin 2021 with such good news! Working together, we hope to provide even better and more impactful services to seniors in Northern Virginia. Shepherd's Center Merges with Great Falls Shepherd's Center

Message from Scott Schroth, SCNOVA Board Chair

By now you have heard about our merger with the Shepherd's Center of Great Falls, combining our resources, volunteers, programs, and leadership to serve a larger swath of the Northern Virginia region. We are proud of and excited about this wonderful opportunity to establish a larger and more vibrant organization to carry on the important work of addressing the service, educational, and social needs of local seniors. We are particularly pleased that the outstanding leadership team of SCGF has joined with us hand-in-hand on this important mission.

The year ahead will be full of positive change as we work to emerge from the constraints of COVID, build out a new SCNOVA organization and website, and collaborate to expand programs and services.

Message from SCGF's President, Philip Pifer

The Shepherd's Center of Great Falls (SCGF) was formed to deliver free rides to non-driving seniors in our town. Great Falls is an area of Fairfax County with no county transportation – neither bus service nor MetroAccess. Taxis and Ubers can be expensive given local driving distances, are at times unavailable or have long waits, and overall are unreliable and not something seniors can risk when going to important appointments.

SCGF affiliated with the Shepherd's Centers of America, raised funding, and started our ride service in 2018. We've now provided hundreds of rides to scores of needy seniors, who use our service as a "last resort" for appointments and errands that are too important to take a chance on missing. We

operated continuously through COVID and have never missed a ride or turned down a ride request. (continued in next column)

Great Falls is a small community, and we realized that combining with another similar organization could reduce operating costs, offer our volunteers more rides, and further expand services to our seniors. The Shepherd's Center of Oakton, Vienna, Reston and Herndon 'fit the bill' perfectly, and they were enthusiastic from our earliest discussions with them. It became clear that we would be good partners, and that we would be able to do much more together than apart.

Now that our two organizations are joining forces to form the Shepherd's Center of Northern Virginia, I couldn't be more excited about taking this step to continue our work together to improve quality of life for our seniors.

Fall Prevention

"Each year, millions of older peoplethose 65 and older-fall. In fact, more than one out of four older people

falls each year, but less than half tell their doctor. Falling once doubles your chances of falling again.

Falls, with or without injury, also carry a heavy quality of life impact. A growing number of older adults fear falling and, as a result, limit their activities and social engagements. This can result in further physical decline, depression, social isolation, and feelings of helplessness.

Many falls do not cause injuries. But one out of five falls does cause a serious injury such as a broken bone or a head injury. These injuries can make it hard for a person to get around, do everyday activities, or live on their own.

What can you do to prevent falling? 1. Have your physician or pharmacist review your medications to make sure they do not make you dizzy or sleepy. 2. Have your vision checked once a year. 3. Do exercises that make your legs stronger and improve your balance." https://www.cdc.gov/falls/facts.html

4 Shots For Seniors

Vaccinations aren't just for kids. Our immune systems tend to slow down and weaken with age. Here are the four vaccinations the Centers for Disease Control suggests for seniors.

- Flu Every fall, before flu season begins.
- Shingles Take this preventative step at any time.
- Pneumococcal Protect yourself at any time.
- Pertussis: If you are in contact with infants and toddlers, ask your doctor about this vaccine. This vaccine may be included in the diphtheria and tetanus shots.
- Also, make sure to keep up with your doctor appointments because missing a doctor's visit may cause a minor condition to escalate to something more serious.
